Board of Directors Meeting 3 Oct 2023

- The Board of Directors meeting of the High Country Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America was conducted 3 Oct 2023 at Basils restaurant, Boone, NC. The call to order by President Frankie Groff occurred at 1720.
 - A. Directors attending:

 - 1. The BOD acknowledges & appreciates the early notification by Directors if <u>unable</u> to attend meetings.
- II. The Agenda (Frankie), Secretary's Report (Lance) & Treasurer's report (George) were sent electronically to the Board prior to the meeting.
 - A. BOD acknowledged receipt of same.
- III. The Pledge of Allegiance occurred at 1721 in presence of the American Flag.

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- IV. A thoughtful invocation was offered by Jim F. emphasizing MOAA fellowship despite divisiveness in National arenas.
- V. The Secretary's Report, for the 5 Sept 2023 BOD meeting, held at Basils restaurant, was received electronically by the Board prior to the meeting.
 - A. The Secretary's Report was summarized by Lance including comments/edits to initial minutes sent subsequent to the 5 Sept meeting.
 - B. The report was accepted unanimously by the Board with no edits.
 - 1. Lance commented that when contacting National MOAA advising that our Member Col Ben Covington had passed, National responded that they placed Ruth Covington as a Surviving Spouse with a MOAA # as such. Lance advised National that Ruth predeceased Ben.
- VI. A detailed Treasurer's Report was previously submitted by George electronically to the Board. Income/Expenses were clearly itemized stating a checking account balance of \$16,442.98 as of 30 Sept 2023 (end of HCCMOAA Fiscal year). Importantly, this is compared to a balance of \$17,020.58 as of 1 Oct 2022 = loss of \$577.60 for the year.
 - A. Included was the operating budget itemizing revenue/expenses & budget/actual amounts, again clearly communicated. Balance reflects cumulative fiscal YTD checking account interest and member dues.
 - B. Report included totals reflecting donations from an encouraging email sent by George to members suggesting a donation to the Chapter to off-set budget shortfalls. Donations = ~\$2,979.
 - C. George offered that he would submit the Chapter's tax return within the5.5 month requirement after close of fiscal year.
- VII. Standing Business
 - A. Discussion of Board of Directors members:
 - 1. Per by laws we should have 14 currently, we have 11.
 - a) Lance asked if Jim Brannum was formally a BOD member answer was No, however hoping for Jim's future participation.

- 2. A suggestion to scrub our current roster for potential BOD candidates was again offered.
- B. Discussion on 2nd quarter General Membership Meeting (GMM).
 - 1. The GMM scheduled for 24 Aug was understandably and unfortunately cancelled due to lack of commitments with only ~25 members responding. Hog Wild caterers had required a 50 person minimum @ \$15/person including delivery.
 - a) The date of **19 Oct 2023** was previously agreed upon.
 - b) Lance negotiated a 1/2 day fee of \$50 & secured a reservation for the Blowing Rock Davant Pavilion. (Receipt to George)
 - c) GMM could be scheduled with Hog Wild with an HCCOAA member picking up the food vs Hog Wild delivery & we would not be confined to a minimum number of attendees.
 - (1) Frankie agreed to run point on this directly with the management at Hog Wild.
 - (a) Ted Alley's participation was mentioned.
 - d) Frankie has sent 2 email invitations with specifics to members & will send at least one more encouraging email.
 - e) Since this General Membership meeting is an 'annual' meeting, election of officers is usual.
 - (1) The BOD agreed, in our previous meeting, to proceed with continuation of Directors in their roles, with their agreement, - consistent with Chapter Bylaws, to flex the terms limits avoiding a perfunctory ballot of unopposed nominees, installations etc.
 - (a) In 2022, the Chapter combined the Veterans Day activities with a GMM including installation of BOD officers.
 - (2) Lance will summarize the year's activities as reflected in Secretary's reports to Frankie as a 'State of the Chapter' - perhaps similar to the 5-Star submission.
 - Recall bylaws require 1/3 of membership (47) to vote on issues @ GMM = ~15.

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- C. Discussions regarding Veterans Day 2023 activities: (11 Nov 2023)
 - Fred has contacted Boone Mall (CK); Community Band (BillyRay Winkler) & WHS MCJROTC (Wes) regarding participation - all agreed similar to previous arrangements.
 - a) BillyRay will contact his colleague (Doug) regarding a lapel microphone availability.
 - 2. George has energetically contacted chair vendor (Festive Elk).
 - a) Ideally: 300 chair delivery 11 Nov 0900. That required an after hrs 'per-diem' of \$90 + \$103.98 limited damage charge.
 - (1) Avoiding this damage charge required including Festive Elk on our liability policy - our Treasurer offered a no to that request.
 - b) The original large fee of \$1,218.67 (vs 2023 Memorial Day \$737.72) was negotiated down to \$770.04 dues to deft skills of our Treasurer as well as Festive's 10% discount & no sales tax.
 - (1) This compared to \$1.150.25 quoted by Jefferson Rental in Ashe County.
 - 3. Discussion surrounding a speaker for the occasion suggested Jim Fisher who was willing but asked for a different presenter for the Invocation.
 - a) Rick W. was mentioned for this role.
- D. Importantly, the Chapter will schedule a flag installation activity at the Mount Lawn Cemetery prior to 2023 Veterans Day, similar to the 2023 Memorial Day activity.
 - 1. Save the dates:
 - a) 28 Oct 'Walk Thru' @ Cemetery @ 1100
 - b) 5 Nov Install flags @1300
 - c) 10 Nov 'Walk thru' @ Mall @1100
 - d) 11 Nov Veterans Day activity @ Boone Mall
 - e) 18 Nov 2023 Remove flags
 - 2. George offered 'Team Brudzinski' to generate the Program/flyer similar to previous templates.
 - a) George mentioned sponsorships @\$100 each to be place on reverse of program.

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- (1) A mention of such sponsors from the podium suggested by Lance.
- b) Lance to utilize program in Public Relations efforts to media outlets.
- E. Update on new HCCMOAA Website
 - 1. George & team have generated an updated website easily navigable and attractive. Https://hccmoaa.org
 - a) Lance asked about location of new member application George pointed to the 'Membership' area of website.
- F. ASU ROTC/WHS MCJROTC update:
 - a) Bob summarized the HCCMOAA speaker series for WHS MCJROTC.
 - (1) Timeframe: Feb-March 2024.
 - (2) Wes prefers a 'younger' cohort of speakers if possible to represent the service branches.
 - (3) A yearly screening/clearance for participants will be required by WHS.
 - 2. Adam informed the BOD that his role as Director of ASU's Military Affairs Committee is official.
 - Adam mentioned the ASU "Heroes Day' activities scheduled for 4 Nov (ASU vs Marshall) @ 1100-1430 @ ASU McKinney Alumni Center. This location worked well in 2022.
 - a) Adam inquired about HCCMOAA support for Heroes Day activities - \$150 was offered in 2022.
 - (1) BOD was supportive of this Fred suggested Adam utilize the 'Request for Funds' form available on the website.
- VIII. The meeting was adjourned at 1816 by unanimous decision with next BOD meeting scheduled for 7 Nov 2023 (**Tues**) @1700 Basils Restaurant.
 - A. Frankie shall communicate with Basils regarding continuation of hosting.
